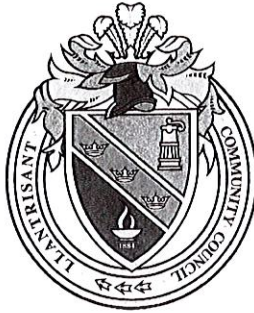

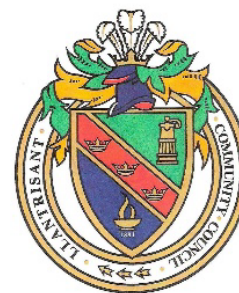

It was agreed to delegate power to the Clerk, in consultation with the Chair of the Finance and General Purposes Committee, to purchase a van to replace the Council's Vauxhall Vivaro; to dispose of by sale the Vauxhall Vivaro; and to authorise such spend as is necessary up to the value of £23,566 (being the current balance of the "New Van Fund" earmarked reserve) plus any receipts for the sale or exchange of the existing vehicle.

In response to some vandalism and theft from certain planter sited in more secluded areas, **it was agreed** that the Clerk may order several to be moved to main road locations, where they would be more visible.

FC/22-23/47 **Allotments**

More information would be required before the Council could consider entering into negotiation with Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council on the possibility of transferring the Penycoedcae and Penygawsi Allotments Sites into the Council's ownership.

FC/22-23/48 **Land at Hunters' Gate, Cross Inn, Llantrisant**

The Clerk reported that correspondence had been received from Rees Wood Terry solicitors, acting on behalf of Llanmoor Development Co Ltd, as to the matter of the adoption of the sewers at land at Hunters' Gate, Cross Inn. The land in question was transferred to the ownership of Llantrisant Community Council in 1998.

A sewer serving the development ran through this land owned by the Council, and it was the intention of Welsh Water to adopt the sewer so that it was to be repaired and maintained by Welsh Water thereafter.

It was therefore a requirement of Welsh Water that the Community Council enters into a Deed of Easement with it as to the length of the sewer that runs within the land owned by the Council.

Having sight of the proposed Deed of Easement, together with the plan denoting the land referred to in the Deed, the Council **agreed** that the Clerk be authorised to sign the Deed on behalf of the Council.

REPORT OF THE CLERK

COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE MEASURE

1. Members have previously indicated that they were minded to consider proposals for assisting the community through the coming period during which fuel and other essential household goods are forecast to become increasingly expensive.
2. Mindful of the already considerable levels of deprivation in the community, it was felt by Members that one way of supporting the community at this time would be to give assistance to the two foodbanks operating in the area.
3. I have consulted both the Beddau Food Angels, based at the Cwm Welfare Hall, and also the Taff Ely Foodbank, based at Coedcae Lane. They operate differently.
4. Beddau Food Angels supply food parcels only, and is not connected with the Trussell Trust. They operate with a small number of volunteers and provide around 40 parcels a week to Beddau and Tynant residents.
5. Taff Ely Food Bank is a Trussell Trust affiliated food bank. They supply food parcels in exchange for chits provided by accredited social and welfare organisations. They can also refer clients to the Fuel Bank, which can provide those in dire need with vouchers for use in pre-payment meters for gas and electricity.
6. The Council is in a position, due to underspends in other budgets within this financial year to respond to the needs of the community, and to vire money into a new budget fund, which I recommend be named the Community Assistance fund.
7. I recommend you vire £10,000 from the underspent Elections Fund into the Community Assistance Fund.
8. I further recommend that you make available £5,000 to each of the Beddau Food Angels and Taff Ely Food Bank, for the purposes of purchasing food for inclusion in their parcels, and with regards to the Taff Ely Food Bank for use if necessary to support their affiliation to the Fuel Bank.
9. I further recommend that you make this fund available immediately.
10. I further recommend that you make this fund available in increments not exceeding £250 per week to each of these food banks. At this rate, the fund should last at least 20 weeks for each of the food banks before exhaustion.

11. I further recommend that you request from each of the food banks a monthly report on their use of the fund, including receipts, numbers of recipients of help, the nature of the help (i.e. food or fuel), etc.
12. I further recommend that Council reviews the operation of this fund again no later than the meeting of Council in February 2022.
