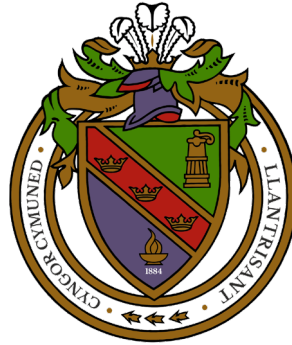

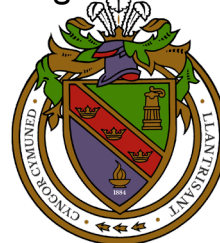

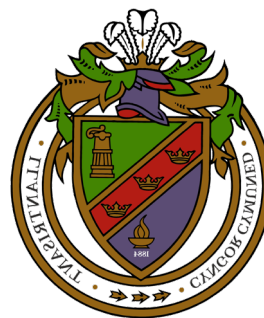

EPC/25-26/01 Apologies for absence

There were no apologies for absence, the full Committee being present.

EPC/25-26/02 Declarations of Interest

Cllrs Julie Barton and Cllr Catherine Preston declared that they were on the board of trustees of Beddau and Tynant Community Library.

Cllr Adam Robinson declared that he was the Vice Chairman of Llantrisant War Memorial Committee, and the Chair of Llantrisant and Talbot Green Together.

Cllrs Anne Callow, Lynne Murdoch and David Brown declared that they were members of Llantrisant and Talbot Green Together.

EPC/25-26/03**Committee Terms of Reference**

- (i) The Committee's Terms of Reference, as agreed at the Annual Meeting of Council on 13th May 2025 was reviewed and noted.
- (ii) It was agreed that in future the draft Annual Report will be presented to the Committee for consideration before being approved by Full Council.

EPC/25-26/04**Events Schedule 2025**

The draft Events Schedule for 2025 was received, considered and **approved**, with the updated iteration reflecting the discussion was attached to these Minutes as Appendix I to these Minutes.

In summary, the additions and amendments to the draft circulated included the following:-

- (i) A reflection on the VE Day commemorations which were very positive.
- (ii) A reflection on the Council Reception for stakeholders held on 29th May 2025, which was a resounding success. Members expressed the wish for a similar event to be held annually. Members also agreed to receive a summary of the feedback received at a future meeting. Cllr Barton offered to circulate thoughts on a possible community awards theme for the next event.
- (iii) It was agreed that it would be useful for elected members and staff to have official name badges at future events for better identification and presence.
- (iv) The Allotments Competition would be held in early July,
- (v) A pro forma would be expected from the organisers of both the Talbot Green Summer Fair and the Beddau and Tynant Summer Fair before the Clerk could approve the deployment of the Council's staff and other resources in support of the events.
- (vi) Whilst the Community Horticultural Show was unlikely to take place again in 2025, it was agreed that a form of competition could be hosted to be held on the same day as the Beddau Community Fair, but with a broader range of categories to include craft and cooking.
- (vii) The Council would support the Pride Llantrisant event on 20th September, with a stall and possibly with the flying of Pride flags in the old town. The organisers

might be invited to apply for financial assistance to contribute to the cost of the event.

- (viii) Remembrance Sunday services were well run, but required a broader input particularly from younger people; and it was agreed that there ought to be greater use of the Welsh language.
- (ix) Although discussions around Christmas were left to a future meeting, it was agreed that the Clerk be given delegated power to decide whether to accept a potential offer again in 2025 from Rhondda Cynon Taf County Borough Council for an event run by them in the old town, or whether to accept any financial contribution to local events in lieu of such an event. In any event, the Committee agreed that a Christmas event should be run in the old town in partnership with usual partners along the lines of previous “Christmas on the Hilltop” events.

EPC/25-26/05 **Time Capsule**

A Report from Cllr Townsend Jones on the progress of the Time Capsule was received, noting the following:-

- (i) The time capsule had been planned for placement in the Museum Room of Llantrisant Church’s renovated bell tower, where historical displays had been taking shape.
- (ii) It had been intended to be housed in a lockable, floor-standing box, likely made from recycled tower timber.
- (iii) There would be no cost to the Council for the siting of the capsule;
- (iv) Work on the bell tower had been progressing toward completion by the Autumn, with the time capsule event being scheduled for early spring 2026.
- (v) The capsule had been meant for opening in 2073, marking 49 years since the 2024 Beating of the Bounds.
- (vi) Letters had been going out to Year 6 pupils’ families at the end of the summer term 2025, with letters going out to all primary school pupils near to the actual date for the concealment.
- (vii) The contents had been reflecting Llantrisant past and present, including a photobook by Gwynfa Camera Club.

EPC/25-26/06 **Future Meetings**

- (i) The general feeling was that the committee’s preference was to meet in person in future, with the offer of attendance online pursuant to Standing Orders.
- (ii) The date of the next meeting would be considered by the Chair in consultation with the Clerk.

There being no further business the meeting was ended at 8pm

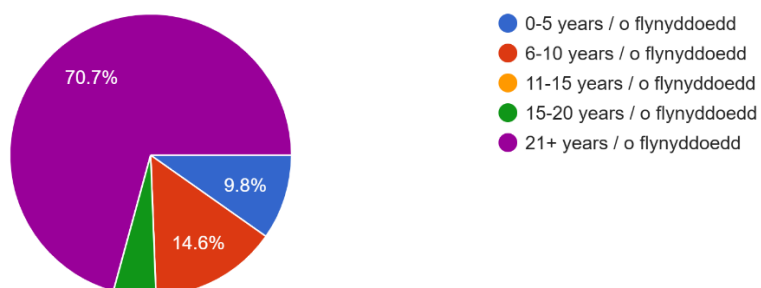

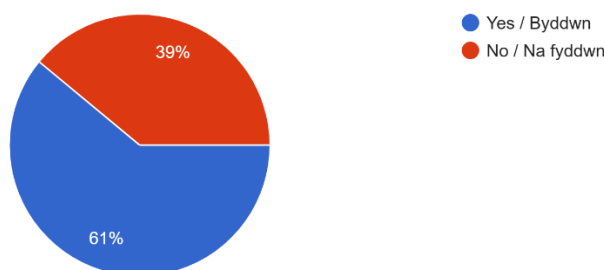

- Skate park and pump track for children too old to use the play parks.
- Youth clubs
- Build a decent skate park
- Organised litter picking, provide an allotment for kids to run.
- Work talks eg. Become a plumber, work with animals, work with AI
- My grandson would like to see a zip line added to the playground at Gwaun Ruperra.
- Ask parents and young people what they would like to see provided. Liaise with schools

- Youth activities. Rugby is amazing.
- Supply more litter bins on the cycle path around the Talbot Green area especially near MacDonalds and have them emptied more often. It's a disgrace the amount of litter that accumulates there, which ends up blown into residential areas, wooded areas and stream harming the environment, looks ugly and attracts rats regularly seen in broad day light. This is not encouraging the younger generation to take pride in their environment. It's quite the opposite, sending the wrong message that it's ok to dump litter. There needs to be signs reminding people it's illegal to drop litter and there are hefty fines for breaking the law if caught. Who would be responsible if someone were to contract Weil's Disease from rat urine (they dribble continuously) and become seriously ill? Food for thought!
- More visibility for parents and children for up and coming events as I do not see them advertised in local shops, etc any more.
- Youth clubs/groups.

- I agree with areas above although more visual special constables would help in crime and safety. To promote small business with rent grants.
- Sorting out the drug problem around Talbot Green with the police would help & stop any more moving in to the area.
- Not really noticed anything.
- Totally agree.
- Don't agree with number 1. Scruffy area with too many people taking drugs and driving cars whilst smoking drugs in the lanes and on the common. Gangs of people intimidating and drinking cans of alcohol in many areas. Both these issues need resolving.
- Agree.
- Firstly I would start by making sure we have a safe community unlike places around the bus station and toilets in talbot Green as it now seems very unsafe with lots of antisocial behaviour by drunks from certain places that the council have rehoused these people. Also I would engage the crime commissioner for our area to reopen our police station in Talbot Green, that would be a start when you try to get a policeman to stop this antisocial behaviour the police station is closed are you kidding, what a joke. Also instead of flags for shops in talbot

Green can we go back to lights please it's shocking we pay the same rates as do the shops in Pontyclun. Llantrisant look far better with their Xmas light than our flags. Do please give some consideration to ALL residents.

- I agree, however services are aimed at young children under 8 and adults. There is no provision for 8 - adult which is desperately needed.
- Stop going backwards about the past. Look forward to the future & invest in the youth.

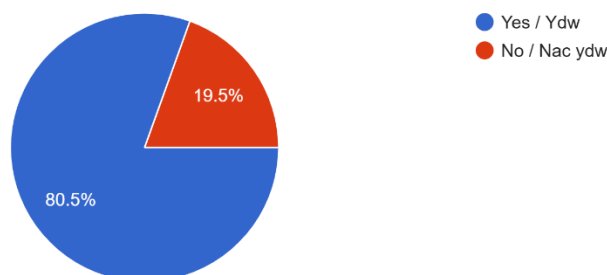
- No.

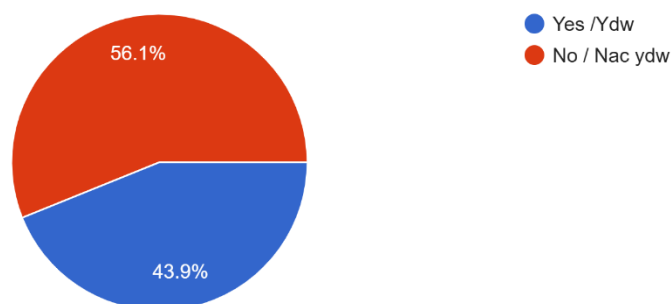
There were 14/41 responses.

- More advertisement of the community council and their aims and objectives. I have lived in beddau for 30+ years and didn't know anything until this brochure came through the door today.
- Need more bins around the shops & dog bins around the streets.
- Potholes need addressing, bring back wheelie bins and bring in a rule that people still owning such bins should put them out of sight not outside their front door making streets look unsightly.
- N/A
- Children over 11 up to late teens are often viewed as 'trouble' and are forgotten. There are few young counsellors who represent them and it feels that the council are more geared towards older peoples hobbies and interest such as gardening, walking, parks. There is a strong Rugby and football culture and plenty of facilities for this, however not all young people are interested in this. Wheeled sports such as scooting, BMX etc are ignored and believed to attract trouble by some of the older generation, which is old fashioned and incorrect.
- If it's because lack of money please ask residents or fundraise to give all communities with your remit the same treatment.
- For transparency the office staffs wages should be published for public inspection. Let the public judge value for money.
- There is a distinct lack of information about the council's activities and officers.
- There are several very shabby properties in the central area of the town which detract badly from what could be a very attractive and eclectic environment with just a lick of paint. Full credit to the owners who have painted their frontages in vibrant colours, but could the council perhaps implement a small grants scheme to encourage others? If a few more owners were incentivised this town could start to look like Tenby or Sneem in Ireland, and that would attract more people to come and sample the many delights that Llantrisant has to offer.
- I would like to see the minutes of meeting and agenda so that I may be able to comment and express my views.
- It would be nice if there was more attention to Yorkdale in the way of hanging baskets, Christmas decorations.
- I agree that the community council has good objectives and intentions but anyone can write a wish list. It's putting those objectives into practice is what the public want to see not loads of written waffle the council would like to do. Make it less wordy in bullet point format of what the council intend to do stating how they are going to do it!
- No idea what the plan is...
- I've lived in TG for over 9 years, this is the 1st time I've seen information about Llantrisant Community Council. Never heard of our Councillors except for Glynne Holmes.

- More advertisement through leaflets and paper. Versions not everyone is on Facebook.
- Please no more allowing any more barbers or hairdressers into Talbot Green.
- Empty house on Gwaun Miskin not lived in for approx 10 years, looks an eyesore with rubbish outside. Someone must own it but nobody ever goes in it.
- Please make our community safe as I was attacked once by a antisocial thug on a motorbike doing a wheelie on a motorbike by Penygawsi school and I told him to slow down he proceeded to kick me while doing a wheelie with bike steel toecaps on and I had to go to hospital where I had blood in my bladder.
- Don't agree with getting rid of bins ,For plastic bags , Buy own, Not good for all that plastic not green at all , You tell us to recycle much we can ,Next you tell put rubbish in black PLASTIC.
- People have petitioned for a decent skate park and pump track in the past, but the council have ignored this and made excuses not to provide them.
- Money saving. No hanging baskets. No Christmas lights. Why do the council need 2 offices ie Caerlan and llys y cwm.
- As the public to volunteer for office duties & aim to reduce costs.
- Community Council needs to be more approachable and open to the public. Surgeries and workshops would be good start.
- Survey had fields where you had to answer without a Don't know or Doesn't apply option.
- I didn't receive the booklet about this survey nor receive any other communication from the council. I have no idea who you are!
- I believe there should be more transparency in how our money is spent , in particular to salaries. If the rumour in regards to recent pay increases is true then this information should be provided to the community . This survey has yes/no answers to some questions without the option to say I don't know.

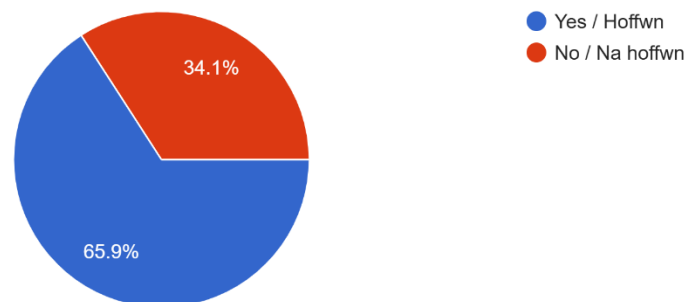
You should also ask why the answer was given to provide yourselves with more insight to why people feel the way they do.

- Would like to see out Community Councillors more visible.
- I want to know if I could hire the room for my counselling and hypnotherapy practice. How can I advertise my services so that any member of the community can feel safe to approach me. I am of course willing to share my success with the council to see the difference I have made.
- Please consider traffic slowing measures on the Llantrisant common road.
- On your website I couldn't see an opportunity to send a simple message directly to the council. I may have missed it but it would be a useful tool to add to the website so that you don't have to go into your emails to send a message.
- Have more local fayres, jumble sales, etc to keep the community meeting up and together. The one on the old cwm coke works railway line is a prime example of Tynant and community spirit.
- Seems to be a lot going on in other areas but not Talbot Green so much. Lots of focus on Llantrisant.
- Struggling with council tax on my property and I'm struggling with the new bin bags model.
